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REMEMBERING HOLY WEEK

“Then the crowds who went ahead of him and those who followed shouted: Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!” - Matthew 21:9



And with those words...Holy Week began. As we begin our Holy Week celebration and head towards Easter Sunday, let's remember the events leading to Christ's crucifixion and resurrection and acknowledge their meaning in our lives. Reflect upon what happened on Palm Sunday, the Sunday before His crucifixion, when Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem with coats and branches laid at His feet and people praising

Him. Those shouting Hosanna, or “save us,” were looking for an earthly warrior to rescue them from the harsh Roman rule.

Although Holy Week ends on Saturday, praise God the story doesn't end there! On Easter Sunday morning, the stone that sealed the tomb was rolled away, and Jesus was resurrected (John 20). He overcame death so that those who trust in Him could also overcome death and one day live with Him in Heaven for all eternity.

Holy Week is about remembering the only **One who is truly Holy—Jesus Christ**. This week, let's take time to gratefully remember and keep alive in our hearts what Jesus, the perfect Lamb and the risen Savior, did for us years ago. **He came, He died and He rose**, so we could live in eternity with a loving God who gave His life for us in the greatest way possible.

As we walk through Holy Week, we encourage you to revisit the details of **Christ's crucifixion, death and resurrection**. Try reading through Mark 14-16. Take your time this week to read slowly and thoughtfully, as you prayerfully think about each of the events described there and their deep and life-changing meaning for each of us.

These days of celebration reach its climax in the Resurrection of Jesus, which is the core of our Christian faith. Pope Francis says, "*Easter means that the love of God is stronger than evil and death itself; it means that the love of God can transform our lives and let those desert places in our hearts bloom.*" Let us experience the mercy of the Father, the love of Jesus and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the day of Easter and the days to come.

Miraculous Touch of Jesus during Inner Freedom Retreat

How can I thank you O Lord how can I praise you O Lord for your marvelous love and mercy has shown towards me during my inner freedom retreat wherein I have received healing of my eye disease which I had been suffering for past 37 years. I thank God the



Almighty for the person of Rev. Fr. Vijayanand S.J a person filled with the spirit of God who had been directing me for many days and made me to go to the depth of my heart, and the past years of life. I realized that I had already reached a stage of depression, sadness, anger, guilt, fear and negative feeling etc., began to hate myself so much. I did not want to live and was completely broken.

I was suffering from my eye disease since 1981 which begun with watering of my eye spots reddening and pricking sensation. I suffered so much pain and was not able to open my eyes. I was treated by many efficient eye specialists in different places like Guntur, Hyderabad, Chennai and Bangalore. They were not able to diagnose correctly but suspected “Virus Keratitis” advised with five different types of eye drops. The pain was increasing I was depressed and I felt to pull out my eyes and throw away because of the pricking sensation. Even Doctors told me that I may lose my sight forever, I may become blind.

I was taking advice from Fr. Vijayanand and even helped me through phone, to work on various negative feelings. This process too was very painful. Many times I experienced more excruciating pain. But Fr. Vijayanand answered me that **pain is the sure sign of healing** and thus he encouraged me to carry on with my difficult process of working on my negative feeling. My pain slowly started to reduce day by day. Father advised me to attend the inner healing retreat. So I made up my mind, placing my complete trust in the Lord that He would heal me. During my inner healing retreat father asked me to continue the same process which was very painful. He was constantly encouraging me to work on the negative feelings until I experienced that freedom of heart. By God’s grace and father’s timely help, continual support and valuable prayers helped me to make a meaningful retreat which purified me and liberated me from the clutches of the painful, negative experience of my past life.

To make the story short I can’t believe how, 37 years of my eye disease got cured!!!After the retreat I had been to the doctor who was treating me for many years, she was surprised to see my healthy eyes without any spots or redness. Since last month I stopped using all my eye drops. It is unbelievable for me how the good God has healed me through the guidance of Rev. Fr. Vijayanand S.J. He made me to realize that my whole misery was by a man’s remark 37 years back. “*Your eyes are welcoming*” and once again I thank God for His healing touch in my eyes and life. I thank Rev. Fr. Viajayanand who had been guiding me with much patience, tolerance, gentleness and prayer. Thank you Jesus praise you Jesus. I pray that Fr.Vijayanand may help many more persons to overcome negative feelings and live happy life to free themselves from different bondages.

Favors received through intercession of Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey

"Whoever asks anything in my name, will be granted to them"

I Mrs. Rajini Mhapsekar, the staff nurse of JMJ Hospital since 2001 would like to share the greatest favor I received by praying to Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey. I am a Christian and my husband is a Hindu. We have a child of 5 years old. I was pregnant for the second time. I had vomiting throughout my pregnancy. With the exception of vomiting; I did not have any problem till the 28th week. In the 28th week, on the 26th of November 2018 at 3.30 am I was awakened by pain in my left thumb. I thought it may be some insect bite, my husband and I did some home remedies. The next day pain was severe and my entire hand was swollen. I was brought to the hospital where the doctor diagnosed the condition as cellulites. The doctor performed aspiration and then I was put on strong antibiotics for 1 month (2 weeks intravascular and 2 weeks oral). The swelling reduced from the upper hand; but, my thumb was still swollen and painful. I was unable to move it. I had returned to the hospital and met the Sisters, who told me that it might have been a poisonous insect bite.



They advised me to go to their hospital in Sivadi, Andhra Pradesh where they have treatment for the same. During this time I had no option but to take leave for a period of 4 weeks. The Sisters also asked me to pray to Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey for a quick recover. So, I and my husband decided to go even though it was so far from Goa. At that time, the orthopedic surgeon was in the hospital, so we took an appointment and consulted him. He advised me for an x-ray of the thumb. When we took the x-ray, doctor found that there was osteomyelitis in my phalanges and doctor performed I&D and pus was drained out.

Again I was put on a strong antibiotic for 15 days. Slowly the pain and swelling came down and I was able to move my thumb. Then, I went for my antenatal checkup, the doctor advised me to have an ultrasound to find out the growth of the baby. The report showed that there was no growth for the long bones of the upper and lower limbs which was contradictory to the period of my pregnancy. I was 33-34weeks of pregnancy at that time. This was performed on 02/01/2019. Then the second scan was done again on 02/01/2019 to confirm the findings. The same conclusion was given. I was so distressed and came to our Sisters crying. They consoled me and asked me to pray to Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey and that she would surely perform a miracle. During the roll call for the nurses,

we used to pray through the intercession of Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey since she was servant of God and all of us know the prayer and we pray for all the staff and patients in rotation 'From the time of that scan, everyone used to pray fervently for me for a safe delivery and a normal baby's, and i rejoined duty on the 3rd January 2019. During my free time I used to cry out to God and pray fervently for the grace for strength and courage to accept the child with all its limitations. I also felt the prayerful support of my colleagues and all the JMJ Sisters in the JMJ Hospital in Porvorim. On the 4th February 2019, the doctor advised another scan to confirm the findings of my baby as per previous scans.

The report was the same as the previous scans, i.e., the baby has short-limb dysplasia. I sent the report to our Sisters through Whatsaap. One of the Sisters replied, "pray to Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey; she will perform a miracle." I prayed fervently to Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey until the 9th February 2019.

I had taken leave one week before my delivery. My first delivery was a Cesarean section; so, the second also was advised as a Cesarean section by the senior-most gynecologist, Dr. Roque Ribeiro. My due date was scheduled on the 18th February 2019; but I selected the date of my birth, 9th February 2019, owing to how precious this baby would be to me and my family. I had prepared myself physically, buying the very best for my baby.

I arrived in the hospital at 9 am. On my arrival, I was told that at the time of the roll call that all my colleagues and Sisters prayed with tears for my intention. They assured me with a lot of love and concern. This same scripture was read out in the Morning Prayer, "Whoever asks anything in my name, will be granted to them." With this faith, I was taken for the surgery and all my colleagues and Sisters were near the operation theatre with tears in their eyes praying for me. There was pin-drop silence in the operation theatre till my baby was out. As my baby came out, there was a loud acclamation, Rajini, your baby is normal and all the limbs are normal." I could not believe it. I thanked God and thank the Lord almighty for all the favors that he has done for me. I would like to name my baby Sthuti (which means praise in my local language) Glowrey. After birth, my baby's length is 43cm, both hands 18 cm, hummers 8 cm, both legs 18 cm, femur 9 cm. I choose to believe that this is a real miracle through the intercession of Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey and I shall pray that she be declared a saint soon.

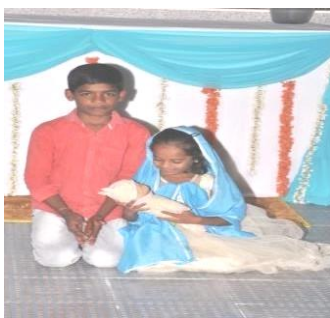

Every person who comes to our institute goes with full life and health. The patient witness is the *advertisement* to all the people. There is no need for any other advertisement. Seeing the need and urgency of present condition with the thought of extending our services to many more people, we felt the need of extending the building with 20 more beds. The provincial council with their big-heartedness allowed us to go for the extension, realising the need to provide happy and healthy life.

We were eager to meet each other – some after long years - could not wait for the scheduled date to start sharing our sweet memories. Hence 22nd, 23rd & 24th we spent together recalling the various incidents of the past, this enriching experience of spending time together is unforgettable.

From 25th to 29th we had seminar guided by Fr. Pushpa Raj S.J. The topic was My Story: Hope, Joy born out of experience, Love, loving & forgiving.

Quoting from the Bible and the book ‘Ravens Wolf’ he elucidated from the group how God places in human beings a burning zeal to accomplish His plan. It is God who calls us for a mission and sustains us. He asked us to share in the group how we hoped and longed to become a missionary sister and realized this by becoming a J.M.J. Sister, and the joy we experienced while facing challenges in our missionary life. We spent a good time reminiscing our past life. Father pointed out from our Constitution article No 46 “As we advance in age we bear fruits of prayer, wisdom and humanness. Aged and infirm sisters can still be effective in the apostolate by sharing the wealth of wisdom gathered in the course of their experience in the service of our mission ...” So it is necessary that the aging sisters share their experiences with the younger sisters of the community whenever a chance arise. Because this will help them grow in faith and courage.

In the afternoon session father stressed on the significance of ‘Love, loving and forgiving’ during our aging. We require moderation in our attachments to people and things. We need boldness to do this, so that we become more attached to God. We need to free ourselves from egoism, learn to take jokes, show our love in action, make our love more tangible etc. It is a time to forgive, and be healed from our past wounds. He summed up the faith-sharing in two words “JESUS & ME”. Oneness with Christ is our hope – Jesus thirsts for our love and we thirst for Jesus’ love.

Using Power point presentation on Aging and Health Fr. Pushpa Raj described the factors that influence our health as we advance in age. He helped us to realize the need for caring

for ourselves and accepting support from others as and when needed. He suggested that we reduce the number of Homes for the aged sisters and that they should be placed in communities of different age group. Living in supportive environments sharing their rich knowledge, will enable them to do what they can, despite losses of capacities. This will in turn, help and motivate the young sisters with a sense of responsibility in caring for the aged. Spending quiet times in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament gives us a lot of energy, to accomplish His will.

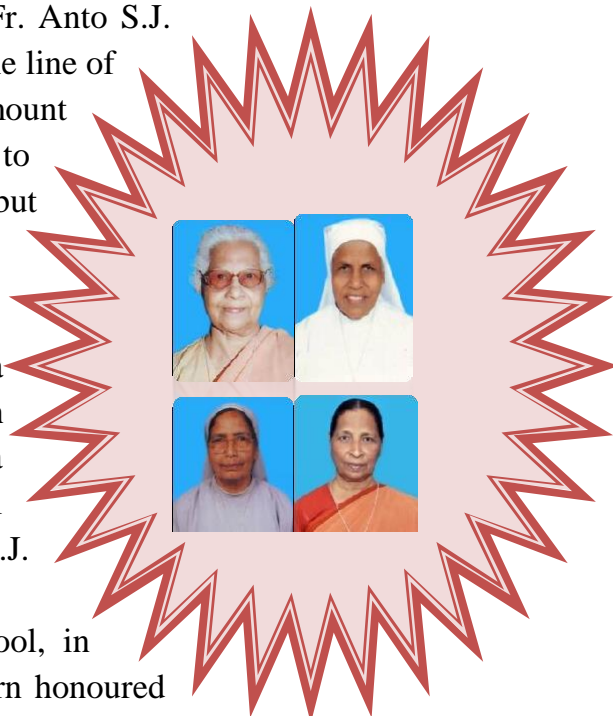
The seminar concluded with evaluation and vote of thanks.
