

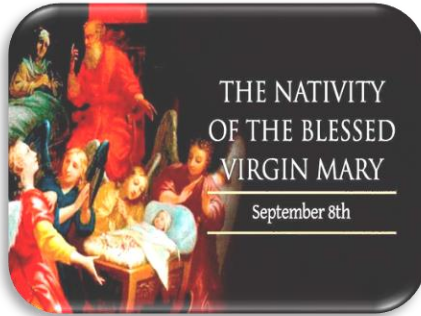

### The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary



We celebrate birthday of our Blessed Virgin Mary on 8<sup>th</sup> September. We have a lot of love for the Blessed Virgin Mary. We love her because our Lord Jesus loved her so much. He loved her so much that he gave his own mother to us at the foot of the Cross. Indeed, as Mary remarks in the Gospels to the Archangel Gabriel, “*all generations will call me blessed*” (Luke 1:48). **“Mary is more blessed because she embraces faith in Christ than because she conceives the flesh of Christ.”**

She served as the ultimate role model for all Christians in her willingness to cooperate with God’s will. So while we rightfully acknowledge her as the Mother of God, the *Theotokos*, we also acknowledge her sanctity and her willingness to do God’s will. Pope Francis gave comforting reminder ‘In Mary, God has prepared a living temple in whom His Son wished to live among us and give us salvation’ and **“God is faithful to His promises.”**

*Let us allow ourselves to be gazed upon.* Especially in times of need, when we are entangled in life’s knots, we rightly lift our eyes to Our Lady, to Our Mother. Yet first, we should let ourselves be gazed upon by Our Mother Mary. When she gazes upon us, she does not see sinners but children. It is said that the eyes are the mirror of the soul; the eyes of Mary, **full of grace**, reflect the beauty of God, they show us a reflection of heaven. Jesus himself said that the eye is “the lamp of the body” (Mt 6:22): the eyes of Our Lady are able to bring light to every dark corner; everywhere they rekindle hope. As she gazes upon us, she says: **“Take heart, dear children; here I am, your Mother!”**

This maternal gaze, which instills confidence and trust, helps us to grow in faith. Faith is a bond with God that engages the whole person; to be preserved, it needs the Mother of God. Her maternal gaze helps us see ourselves as beloved children in God’s faithful people, and to love one another regardless of our individual limitations and approaches. Our Lady keeps us rooted in the Church, where unity counts more than diversity; she encourages us to care for one another. Mary’s gaze reminds us that faith demands a tenderness that can save us from becoming lukewarm. Tenderness: the Church of tenderness. Tenderness is a word that today many want to remove from the dictionary. When faith makes a place for the Mother of God, we never lose sight of the centre: the Lord, for Mary never points to herself but to Jesus; and our brothers and sisters, for Mary is Mother. Dear Mother Mary, we ask you to always place us with your Son and let us know Him, love Him and serve Him more dearly and closely. Stand guard over our hearts and let His gift of peace and love remain deep within our beings, today and always.

Born in Glory in loving all to gain eternal life. It was a day to offer our glowing tribute to Dr. Sr. Mary Glowrey, recalling the life of love and services rendered with tender care and dedication, the life that faded away on 5<sup>th</sup> May 1957 to glow bright eternally.

On this special occasion of recalling her birth in heaven we, the JMJ sisters of St. Stanislaus campus gathered near the place of her burial in true devotion and love. We had the privilege of being united in prayer through the meaningful hour of prayer led by Sr. Sicily and Sr. Julie.

It was a moment to recall her life in brief. Sr. Mary Glowrey, who made a very great sacrifice of her life, renouncing the world of prosperity, the world of ease, the world of pleasure, the world of name and fame, the world of wealth, the world of employment, sacrificed her own native country, her beloved parents and all her near and dear ones. In spite of all the objections from her family, she took courage to travel to a strange country, in order to answer the call of her beloved and follow His holy will.



We were led to recall the life of Sr. Mary Glowrey, who dedicated her life to care for the sick and bring consolation to the afflicted. Unparalleled was her sacrificial service of love in attending to the crowds who used to flock to her for medical assistance, Sr. Mary Glowrey was an exemplary and model religious, simple, sincere and dedicated. The poor were the people of her choice and terminally ill patients had a special place in her heart. Her life was a holocaust as was her terminal illness.

Capturing the very inspiring aspects of her life, we prayed the prayer of Sr. Mary Glowrey followed by Rosary and Chaplet of Mercy. Believing in the promises of Christ we prayed the prayer for the canonization of Sr. Mary Glowrey with a deep desire that she be raised to the altar of GOD.

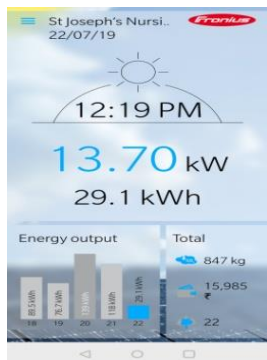
*The ten steps to become eco friendly are :*

5. Buy recycled products
6. Plant more trees
7. Protect local water resources
8. Plastic free
9. Use paperless and recycle more
10. Become more aware of natural resources.

St. Joseph's College of Nursing Dargamitta, the management and staff and students have taken a decision on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2018 to follow the eco friendly atmosphere in the campus:

1. Swatch Bharat awareness programme was conducted for students by Govt. of India Ministry of Information & Broadcasting field outreach Bureau in our campus.
2. Elocution competition was held for students and prizes were distributed by Chair person of the Organization.
3. Student's staff and employees collect all the waste paper, old news papers, and unnecessary papers and send it to ATC Company which is located in Nellore to recycle and send back to us either note books or cash once in three months.
4. Plastic free campus. All our community sisters were given cloth bag to carry whenever they go for shopping.
5. Many trees are planted newly and some are replanted. 4<sup>th</sup> town police station Circle Inspector Mrs. Nagashewari and group planted plants and gave some freely.
6. Less stationary are bought and printing is reduced by sending through SMS, Whatsapp messages and emails.

**Installation of Solar Electric power generating Panels:** The electricity bill payment for the year 2018 is Rs. 7,48,647.00



including the non use of electricity in the hostel and college. The average monthly electricity bill came to Rs. 74,500. As the monthly bills were high, we the management thought of for three months and got three



quotations to install 30kwp (Kilowattpeak) costing 20,40,000 and sent to provincial council for approval. The power generated at solar panels transmitted to the distribution company through a 'Net meter'. The solar power generated each month

and power consumed gets reflected in the monthly bill. If the power generated is more than the power consumed then the consumer gets paid at the rate of Rs: 3 per unit.

You can see in the picture the daily solar energy production in the graph and amount of money saved and decreased CO<sub>2</sub>, With God’s blessings we have collected pending fees from students. This encouraged us to go for Solar Electric power generation plant. We completed all the formalities and started using Solar Electricity. We could at least save 30,000 to 40,000 per month. Our investment could return back within 3years.we are grateful to Provincial and council for giving us the permission to install this big project which is first in congregation of JMJ.



**ISO certification to college.**

We have received an ISO Certificate to St. Joseph’s College of Nursing Dargamitta. The certificate says that the quality management system of St. Joseph’s College of Nursing has been assessed and found to be accordance with the requirements of the quality standards ISO 9001:2015.dated 09.04.2019. Every year we have to renew the certificate. We are proud to be ISO certified.

**NEW BORN CHILD – JMJ DIVYAVANI IN BANGALORE PROVINCE**

**(25<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER 2010)**

JMJ Bangalore Province during the Provincial chapter 2009-2010 decided to have province catechetical centre in St. Mary’s Campus, as it is known for its spirituality and faith in the surroundings. It has its own history in collaborating with diocese of Nellore and St. Joseph’s Cathedral parish to reach out to people in their spiritual need in the past.

As God has his own plan in everything, rightly in those days I was searching for an experience of God. So I requested to have a break from my daily hum-drum of life. So the provincial council gave me a chance for 1month retreat in Mangalore Ryshivana. During this retreat on the 27<sup>th</sup> day, I encountered Jesus,

discovered God. Then the provincial council thought it will be better along with the spiritual experience, spiritual knowledge also will help. So I was sent to do Vishwadeep in Bangalore to do diploma in faith education and youth ministry. As I returned home, with spiritual knowledge and experience, the moment I was asked to work out for the centre I embraced it.

From 22<sup>nd</sup> March onwards, ground work was started with the help of Rev. Fr. Thanikala George SDB, Vishwadeep Director and who was also my Rector, Sr. Showrilu Allam my spiritual guide, Superior of St. Mary's Convent , few ideas taken from Rev. Fr. Kunduri Joji SJ , and Sr. Amala Karnam Evangelization Counselor in charge JMJ Bangalore Province. During this ground work , continuous contact with Sr. Sundari Singareddy, the provincial superior of Bangalore province gave me also internal motivation and great support. So the ground work came to an end by 24<sup>th</sup> October.

On 25<sup>th</sup> October 2010, JMJ Divyavani Kendram was inaugurated by Most Rev. M.D. Prakasam, Bishop of Nellore. Bishop was pleased by the provincial council for taking such spiritual initiation. He appointed Divyavani Director a youth lady animator for the diocese of Nellore and he sent Divyavani Director to the regional , national, international meetings which enriched and updated with first-hand information. His encouragement and approval was great.

First team of JMJ Divyavani Sr. Basilisa , Sr. Johanna Maria and self, as we are surrounded by catholic families, visiting the families, listening to them and praying for them in St. Joseph's cathedral parish, visiting the patients in St. Joseph's Hospital became a daily affair.

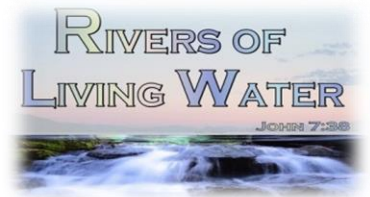
The aim of Divyavani is to be inspirational and functional, through Sunday catechesis we processed child catechesis, during holidays we organized, "Pragathi Balalu Pavithra Grandham" for the students, we also distributed bibles for different JMJ institutions. Through youth ministry we concentrated on youth catechesis, by visiting the families we concentrated on family catechesis.

Divyavani also has its own inspirational aspect. We visited the communities, studied the catechetical situation of the province and presented a report in general body meeting. During this period we concentrated on community catechesis taking the theme on Emmausian method of faith formation. Couple of years we also ran bulletin to catechize the sisters in catechetical perspective.

2011 we released rosary CD in Telugu during centenary celebration of St. Mary's convent and catechetical exhibition was also organized. 2013 we released quarterly Telugu magazine. We conducted couple meet and renewal program to catechize the families. During the year of faith we prepared material on four pillars of faith and organized animation program for youth and released CD by name "*Viswasame Na Upiri*".

### **Genesis of JMJ Convent, Kadaba**

***“Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” - 1 Thessalonians 5:18***

***First and foremost we thank God for his marvellous love that He has bestowed upon us and for choosing us to be the Instruments of his handiworks. We also thank the Provincial and Council for the great opportunity given to us to be the Pioneers of the Kadaba Mission.***



In the year 2016, the then Most Rev. Aloysius Paul D’souza, Bishop of Mangalore had requested Provincial team to start a community of Health care ministry at Kadaba as there were no medical facilities for the people of that area. On 25.04.2016, permission was sought from the Superior General to start the dispensary but due to various reasons this was not realized at once and meanwhile the land conversion was in the process and it took long time. On 7<sup>th</sup> September 2018, Sr. Sundari Singareddy on behalf of Society of JMJ, Bangalore Province had purchased the land near the parish church at Kadaba. On 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2019, the Provincial team visited the place and met Present Bishop Most Rev. Peter Paul Saldanha who suggested to start health care ministry without delay. At last, God gave us an opportunity to start our mission at Kadaba. On 30<sup>th</sup> May 2019, we had a day of preparation and orientation, in the evening mission sending service was conducted.



By the Grace of God, we started our journey towards Kadaba on 30<sup>th</sup> of May 2019 at 9.30 pm from Bangalore and we reached our flat at 5.40am on 31<sup>st</sup> May. We refreshed ourselves and since that day was dedicated to our Lady, we prayed the Rosary. Then at 10.00 am we invited our Parish Priest Fr. Ronald Lobo to bless our house. We had showers of blessings on us and on our flat. At 11.00 am, Sr. Anthony Mary our Provincial Superior and Dr. Shankar Prasad Medical Superintendent of St. Philomena’s Hospital and Mrs. Sopy Madam our legal adviser came and we completed the formalities of making agreement for rent. It was decided to give the name as JMJ Clinic & Dispensary.



On 10<sup>th</sup> of June, at 11.30 am we had the ceremony of Installation of the Superior . It began with a short prayer conducted by Sr. Luviza followed by cutting of the cake and wishing us, as pioneers to have good success in our mission. At 4.30pm, we had Inauguration and blessing of our clinic. Fr. Alfred Pinto the Dean of Puttur, Fr. Ronald Lobo - Parish Priest of Kadaba and Fr. Amith from Panja Parish were present for the function. Fr. Alfred Pinto on behalf of the Bishop officiated the blessing of the clinic.



We had a short programme of half an hour wherein the dignitaries of the Kadaba Taluk were present. They were honoured with a flower bouquet and memento. Nearly 30 sisters and 300 people participated in the function. People were very happy by our presence and have great expectation from us to provide health care in this locality.

We started our mission with full vigor and enthusiasm. On the first day, free treatment was given to all the patients. Day by day patients are increasing and most of them come to our clinic with confidence and trust that they will be healed from their ailments. At present, a good number of the patients have experienced our medical care and are flocking towards our clinic. Within these 3 months, nearly 3600 patients were treated and all are satisfied with our treatment and hoping for the speciality hospital.

17<sup>th</sup> August 2019 is a memorable day in the long standing history of Our Lady of Fatima (O.L.F) Hospital, Porumamilla - Bangalore Province. As a famous saying goes, **“If you build it, they will come”**, the J.M.J. Community at Porumamilla with the permission and the blessing of the



members of the Provincial Council has launched on 17.09.2018 the construction of the New O.P.D. and also a comprehensive renovation of the existing Medical Ward. With God’s Grace and the tireless efforts of the members of the Community, Architect, Engineer, Contractor and by the hard work of the daily laborers, was successfully accomplished.



Walt Disney said, “You can design and create, and build the most wonderful place in the world. But it takes people to make the dream a reality.” This was made true when our beloved Provincial, Priests, Sisters, Staff, many of our parishioners and well-wishers joined us on 17<sup>th</sup> August 2019.
