

A three days seminar i.e. $13^{th}-15^{th}$ January 2022 was arranged for the first year Temporarily Professed Sisters (TPS) . Fr. John Sekhar OFM was the resource person for 2 days followed by sessions by Srs. Mary K., Anthony Mary & evaluation by Sr. Luviza on the third day.



The topics dealt were -

> The call is to follow me:

- Every new day is a sign that God calls me, once again anew! Every new day is a day to hear the words of Jesus, "Follow me" Every new is a sign that God loves me, wants me and needs me as His beloved believer and Disciple.
- It all starts with God: For everything, absolutely everything, above and below, visible and invisible... Everything gets started in God and finds its purpose in God. (Col 1:16)
- You are Called: You have been created as a human person, a sign that God has called you: you are very much in the plan of God and that is why you are here! With the acknowledgement that God has called you...your life gains focus...your life finds a right path.

> The purpose of your life:

- It is not so much what I want to do in my life for me. But it is about what God wants me to do for Him in my life.
- It is about how God wants me to live my life for Him.
- It is about living our life as His beloved, Believer and Disciple.
- It is only in God that we discover our origin, our identity, our meaning, our purpose, our significance and our destiny.

There after we visited St. Joseph's convent, Prashanthi Nilayam, B.Ed College and returned by 8.00 pm. Each place they conducted short prayer service followed by felicitation - garland, shawl and gifts.

On 12th March from 10.00am to 01.00 pm we had batch get together sharing our rich experiences, awes & pains from Golden years to Diamond after that we also exchanged some gifts as token of our love & relationship.

Kindness Beyond Boundaries....

'Do things for people, not because of who they are or what they do in return, But because of who you are...'

Our joys will be greater, our love will be deeper, and our lives will be fuller because we shared the pain and agony of two unknown people at the loss of their loved one in an unexpected train tragedy, which took away the life of young boy in the dark night of 4th May 2022. Mrs. Pampa along with her only younger brother and her husband Mr. Tapas Chandra boarded train on 3rd May to travel to Bangalore for their livelihood. Two of them had confirmed ticket for sleeper class while Mr. Premanand had waiting list. The three decided to adjust 2 berths after paying the fine to ticket collector. They took turns to sleep for few hours and shared the berths. Prem walked up to the sister and brother – in –law and told



them to sleep and decided to sit near the door of the compartment for a while. He never knew that this act of him will take his life away on that fateful night. Train finally arrived at Yesvanthpur station and the couple got down from the train and waited expectantly for Prem to get off the train. But Prem never got down even after all the passengers were left. Panic driven couple started hunting for Prem and searched the whole train fanatically hoping that he may be sleeping somewhere. Their efforts were in vain and could not find Prem. Anxiety and fear gripped them and approaching the railway police lodged a missing complaint.



On 5th May at around 5.30 pm they received call from police that Prem's body was found on a railway track near Venkatachalam 15 kms away from Nellore town. On hearing the sad news of their loved ones' demise they left to Nellore and reached on 6th May. They were shattered in a totally strange place, among strange people with an unknown language and more over with immense pain of losing the youngest member of the family. The two of them could only witness the harassment by the police and demand for money at every step. Mrs. Pampa could not believe her eyes to see her lifeless brother with whom

she shared lot of joyful moments for almost 15 days of her being at home. They faced so much of difficulty to get the postmortem done and were confused as to how to take the body to West Bengal as the

cost of shifting by road was high and beyond their ability to pay. The ISI (Indian Social Institute) of Bangalore got the news and plight of these migrants and through Sr. Lilly ED JMJ contacted the JMJ communities in Nellore. We, the sisters of St. Joseph's Convent, Dargamitta moved with compassion and gripped by the entire situation responded to the call and wanted to be of help to them by all means. Sisters started enquiring through various sources the chances to transport the body by rail cargo services, formalities etc. but transporting body through rail was difficult because of the legal procedures involved in it. Understanding the difficulties, sisters reached the Government Hospital to aid the young couple and



learnt that the couple decided to cremate the body of Prem here in Nellore as it was not feasible to shift the body to West Bengal. Mr. Tapas Chandra and Mrs. Pampa were totally shattered with the thought how to explain and console parents who could not even have the a glimpse of their only son. The couple were broken and inconsolable not able to digest the death of the young chap. Since they were asked to collect the documents on the following day we brought them to convent and accommodated them. More than a place to stay, they needed most the words of consolation, a shoulder

to lean on and cry and comfort of loved ones which they lacked in a strange place. As our sisters kept company with them no words could console them and the only thing we could offer them was our presence...Just being there. Every sister of the community made sure that they were comfortable and ate something, Holy mass and special rosary was offered for the repose of the soul of Prem and prayed for the family. The following day two sisters accompanied them to cremation ground to collect the Ashes of Prem and then proceeded to railway police station to complete the documentation process.

All through, we saw a ray of hope and an ounce of consolation in their grief stricken faces, we also could sense the financial crisis they are in and supported them by some monetary help. We arranged travel back to their native place but with Ashes of Prem. They left with grief and heavy hearts, touched by the humanness and kindness of Sisters of JMJ.

We as a community whole heartedly thank Sr. Lilly ED and Jesuit fathers at ISI for this unique opportunity to be of help to the needy migrants through their effective networking.

We uphold the parents of Prem and Mrs. Pampa in our prayers who are in great trauma of losing their only son and brother and did not even have a chance for the last glimpse of him. May God of consolation be with them always.

I have been blessed with this privilege, and with it comes the power to make change. As I understand, the Call today is that the Jesuits and partners understand the poor and walk with them in their 'complexities, vulnerabilities and richness'. We need to be neither admirers of the poor nor have pity on them. The question is how do we accompany the poor?

Here dwell the peaceful persons whom God favours. I was warmly welcomed by a very dynamic director, Fr. Joseph Xavier SJ, a person full of affability, tranquillity, and

spirituality. Fr. Joe along with the administrator, Fr. Francis Balaraj and other fathers and all staff members in the campus are exuberant with garden greenery and fragrant flowers and one can feel sincerely that ISI is really an abode of God. Here, I realize and experience God's work.

Every rich and nurturing experience at Indian Social Institute, Bangalore (ISIB), invites me to give thanks to God. It is a great opportunity to be deeply rooted and to grow a step higher in my life journey. It is indeed a great joy to know many people from different places and cultures, experience their personality and warmth. It is a beautiful occasion to share my life with each other in all the activities assigned to me. I am sincerely indebted to Fr. Joseph Xavier SJ, Fr. Joy James SJ, the vice president of ISI, and Fr. Francis Balaraj, for their constant accompaniment and encouragement.

ISI-B is a place of learning and a research and training centre. I thank them for imparting me knowledge about the Indian Constitution, organizing systematic cadre and capacity building of youth programmes in Kerala, and giving me many learning opportunities. I am working as a regular staff, as facilitator of programmes in Kerala in the Social Inclusion and Democracy Unit. I travel to Kerala as per the needs of the programmes. My main work is to plan, coordinate and implement training programmes in Kerala and to participate in some NGO programmes in Bangalore, participate in the



preparation of the resource modules, to initiate and strengthen partnerships in Kerala, to maintain live contact with partner organizations and follow up with the potential cadres to encourage and guide them, to maintain documentation of the programmes organized, reports, evaluations and the programmes organized virtually on critical issues and submitting bills and vouchers after the training with proper documentation.

I am grateful to my provincial Sr. Antony Mary Dasari for clearly presenting her ideas on walking with the poor and the excluded, especially working in collaboration with the Jesuits. I admire her passion and commitment to transform the lives of millions of poor in the world, especially those chained by the cycle of poverty and deprivation, living in the developing countries.



ISI-B works in close collaboration with different organizations and institutions. The knowledge I gained through this institute has helped me to be self-confident and a person with dignity. This institution has given me exposure to social work at the grassroot amongst the most marginalized. Field-based activities helped me to understand the issues faced by the adivasis, dalits, fisherfolks, women, youth, children, migrants, etc. I am happy to say that earlier the Institute had only one zone in Kerala, AADI at Attapadi, Palakkad. Currently, for

the next cycle of basic training, with the help of the fathers, I have worked out 4 Zones in Kerala, namely, Kozhikode, Wayanad, Trivandrum and Kollam districts.

In Kozhikode and Wayanad districts the focus will be on the adivasi or tribal communities. In Trivandrum district I will be training youth from the fisherfolk communities and in Kollam district, dalit youth will be trained. Youth of these areas will be capacitated through various training sessions on socio-cultural analysis, Panchayath Raj, social movements, care for common home, people's entitlements, and social animation skills, who will lead their local communities. Kerala unit will be organising 3-day training sessions for 35 youth in each zone once in every 3 months.

Finally, I can say that by organising many training programmes and due to my proactive participation in all common activities I have gained a lot, as ISI plays a vital role in the development of every individual and communities with intellectual depth in building dalit, Adivasi, women and youth collectives for social change.

I have been working at ISI-B for 10 months. I consider this opportunity as a unique gift in my life as I have received so many blessings. In the beginning everything looked strange as I was not prepared to work in an institution in a systematic manner. I felt that my capacities were limited. Everyone I came in contact with taught me something. I met so many wonderful people who inspired me to cross my limits. They taught me to think more about society first and myself later. I can proudly say that I have grown. I am a different person now. I owe all this to ISI-B, the staff and the partners.

Future Shining Stars (School Dropout Programme)



This was an initiative that came as an inspiration to one of the sisters at JMJ Nilayam. This was further offered as an intention in the Holy Mass to know if it was God's Will. From there, God's presence was experienced at each step of this movement. This programme started by holding a meeting for the Self-Help Group members who were then asked to identify the dropouts from their neighbourhood. The students who had failed or dropped out of school owing to Covid - 19 pandemic were identified. The following measures were undertaken to support this initiative:

- 1. Classes were held for the dropouts' students with the children of the SHG members.
- 2. Every day starts with a prayer followed by music, English, computer and Behavioural etiquettes session
- 3. Many individuals came forward to help in this initiative. It included MSW students and Nursing Students from the St. Philomena's College of Nursing under the guidance of Sr. Lourdu Mary
- 4. Sr. Catherine and Sr. Rose of Lima are great pillars of support to this programme.
- 5. Financial Support was rendered by the benefactors of Charity Promotion Movement generously. These funds were used to provide lunch to the students.
- 6. This programme was initiated on the 30th March 2022 and was formally inaugurated on 11th May 2022 by Fr. Joseph Susainathan our Parish Priest in the presence of Sr. Marina Yeruva the Superior, Mrs. Roseline Albert the Principal of Sacred Heart Community College and many other benefactors.





- 7. To foster the habit of reading one hour is set aside for children to use the library everyday.
- 8. The students are also made to do gardening to nurture love for the Natural environment.
- 9. We have collaborated with Don Bosco Fathers and St. Josephs' Indian Community College for the future training of the children.
- 10. There has been immense support of Sr. Mary Kalavathi and Sr. Marina Yeruva for the smooth functioning of this programme

New mission extended and shifted...




JMJ Sneha Sadan began a new mission with a vision to empower the women, dropout girls during the covid-19, to find a living and a carrier to face the realities of life. In January 2021, we began skill training center at Kogilu for the women and girls of the four slums in the neighbourhood namely Mittaganahalli, Reva Nagar, Bellahalli and extension of Bellahalli with migrants of Uttar Pradesh and Uttara Karnataka in collaboration with Dream India Network (DIN) and MCKS Happy Jeevan Tailoring Drive.

12 students were trained for 6 months and they received the certificate and a tailoring machine on January 27th 2022.

The 2nd batch of empowering women and girls tailoring training is shifted to JMJ Convent, Nagavara and the course begins in June 2022. JMJ Sneha Sadan, Kogilu community though ideal, students were found it difficult to reach the centre due to improper transport facilities, and we are not able to render better service to the people around. Our JMJ institutes look out for better service to a larger group. Let's wish and pray that this centre will be a centre to empower the women to face life and transform their life and live a better living in the Society.


